Cameron County Confirms Fifth COVID-19 Related Death

Cameron County has received confirmation of its fifth COVID-19 related death of a Cameron County resident. The 77-year old male was from Los Fresnos. This is the first COVID-19 related death of a community transmission case. The individual had been previously reported as a case for Cameron County.

"It saddens me that we have lost another individual from our community to this deadly virus and, unfortunately, this individual is our first community transmission death and not related to the nursing home cases," stated Cameron County Judge Eddie Trevino, Jr. "Our deepest sympathies to his family and friends. Our thoughts are with them during this difficult time."

Cameron County has also received confirmation of an additional nine (9) reports of COVID-19. This includes the following:

This raises the total number of cases to 279 in Cameron County. Of the 279 cases, 102 individuals have recovered.

- Practice physical distancing by keeping your distance 6 feet from others.
- If you are sick, call your doctor and home isolate.

- Avoid touching eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands
